DMA-ITES EXCEL IN BOARD RESULTS

May 13, 2024

All India Senior Secondary Central Board Result 2024 was announced on May 13th 2024. DMA once again annexed splendid success by performing brilliantly in the Board Examinations. The total of 407 students that had appeared in the examination, 52 students i.e 12.7 % secured 90% and above in aggregate; 187 students i.e 45.9% got Distinctions and 347 students i.e 85.25% secured First Divisions . Shipra Siddhartha emerged as the school topper by securing highest marks in aggregate i.e 98.8 % in the stream of Humanities while Prashasti Saxena topped the Commerce Stream securing 95.0 % . Radhika Singhal has been the topper of Science stream with 97.2%.





It's worth mentioning that 38 students of our brilliant lot marked a scintillating success touching the perfect score of hundred in different subjects.

While in AISSE -2024, all 309 students who had appeared, achieved success with flying colors.

Shreysth Verma made the Academy proud by securing the first position with 98.8% marks, while Ishu Baliyan stood second with 98.6% marks. A staggering number of 91 students ie 29.4%, secured 91% and above in aggregate, 215 students ie 69.6%, secured distinction, and 278 students ie 90%, secured 60% and above in aggregate.

Principal Dr. (Mrs.) Ritu Dewan applauded the staff and students for their efforts in bringing laurels to the school and congratulated the DMA fraternity on the glorious success of the proud DMA-ites. In a resounding finale, she hailed their achievements as a beacon of inspiration for all.
